SUBJECT: - TROPHY HUNTING IN GILGIT-BALTISTAN FOR THE HUNTING SEASON 2026-2027

The Parks & Wildlife Department Gilgit-Baltistan offers the following Trophy Hunting Permits of wild ungulates for open bidding in respective Conservancies/CCHAs to be held on 10th September 2026 at 10:30 AM in the conference hall of Forest Complex Jutial Gilgit. Trophy hunting will be conducted as per the "GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019". The hunting season for ungulate species shall begin on 15th day of October 2026 and end on 10th April 2027.

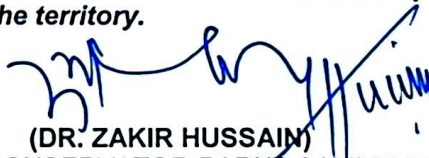

General Terms and Conditions

1. This invitation for open bids is valid for all companies, authorized agents and outfitters registered with Parks & Wildlife Department Gilgit-Baltistan. Individual hunters can also participate under non-exportable category.
2. Out of the total 40 non-exportable trophies for Himalayan Ibex under national category, 12 trophies will be reserved and the remaining trophies will be offered for competitive bidding as per above table. The reserved trophies will be offered at the highest bid offered in that particular CCHA/Conservancy to interested individual hunters on first come first serve basis after completing all codal formalities while 01 permit of Blue Sheep under non-exportable category shall be reserved.
3. Out of the 04 exportable quota of Astore Markhor, since 01 permit of Astore Markhor has been extended for the current hunting season, so 03 permits shall be put on auction.
4. Hunting shall be permissible only in the designated Conservancies/CCHAs.
5. All interested hunters, outfitters, companies and individuals shall deposit, the call deposit against each trophy mentioned in above table in the name of Chief Conservator Parks & Wildlife Gilgit-Baltistan prior to participation in the auction proceeding.
6. Detailed terms & conditions and GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019 are available with the office of the undersigned or through e-mail ccpw@fwegb.gov.pk.

7. Arrangement of logistics including travel, boarding, lodging, import and export permits, insurance, and visa etc. will be the responsibility of hunters or their facilitators (outfitters or companies).
8. All hunters shall be required to collect their hunting permits by visiting the office of concerned DFO/WLMOs in person. The hunters in collaboration with respective RFOs will be required to present the trophy and the recording of its measurement (duly endorsed by the hunter, outfitter, community representative, and concerned RFO) for physical examination and endorsement by the DFO. ***This will be a pre-requisite for the issuance of NOC for transport of the trophy beyond the jurisdictions of Gilgit-Baltistan.***
9. Only the hunters having valid permit will be allowed to hunt. Furthermore, permits issued to GB residents shall not be transferable to non-GB residents on concessional rates.
10. It will be the responsibility of the hunter himself/herself or his/her facilitator (outfitter or company) to acquire CITES export permit from the CITES Management Authority, Ministry of Climate Change & Environmental Coordination, Govt. of Pakistan.
11. The respective community organization will be responsible to take the hunter to the hunting site under the supervision of on duty staff of the Department.
12. The Department will not be responsible for any accident, sickness, falling down or death of the hunter or any other person accompanying him.
13. 100% of the hunting permit fees will be retained in case of non-hunt unless for reasons given in clause 19.1 of the GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019.
14. The Department reserves the right to accept or reject any or all the tenders of trophy hunting permits under clause 36(1) of Gilgit-Baltistan Public Procurement Rules 2022.
15. The hunting permits issued for Markhor, Ibex and Blue Sheep shall be Conservancy/CCHA specific and will be non-transferable to any other Conservancy/CCHA unless for reasons mentioned in clause 13.6 of GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019.
16. Successful bidders of trophy hunting permits shall deposit trophy hunting permit fee and other dues within one month after the auction date, failing which the earnest money/call deposit will be forfeited and the permit will be offered to the next qualifying bidder.
17. All outfitters/companies shall be required to register with the Department. The registration fee shall be Rs 20,000 per outfitter/company and shall be valid for a period of 03 years.
18. Any outfitter/company/entity/hunter whose past hunting/outfitting related actions are under scrutiny/investigation shall not be eligible to participate in the bidding.
19. The outcome of the proceedings of the trophy hunting bidding shall be conditional and subject to the quota allocation from CITES Management Authority (CMA) Ministry of Climate Change & Environmental Coordination (MOCC&EC).

Caution: Hunting of Astore Markhor, Blue Sheep and Himalayan Ibex is an extremely challenging sport which requires complete physical fitness and patience. The hunters should be prepared for rugged difficult slopes & extremely cold weather of the territory.
