Dated the 22nd September, 2026**SUBJECT: - 2ND BIDDING UNDER TROPHY HUNTING IN GILGIT-BALTISTAN FOR THE HUNTING SEASON 2026-2027**

The Parks & Wildlife Department Gilgit-Baltistan offers the following Trophy Hunting Permits of Himalayan Ibex (unsold permits in the 1st auction) for open bidding in respective Conservancies/CCHAs to be held on 8th October, 2026 at 10:30 AM in the office of Chief Conservator Parks & Wildlife Department, Forest & Wildlife Complex Jutial, Gilgit. Trophy hunting will be conducted as per the "GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019". The hunting season for ungulate species shall begin on 15th October 2026 and end on 10th April 2027.

General Terms and Conditions

1. This invitation for open bids is valid for all companies, authorized agents and outfitters registered with Parks & Wildlife Department Gilgit-Baltistan. Individual hunters can participate for non-exportable permits.
2. Hunting shall be permissible only in the designated community-managed Conservancies/CCHAs.
3. All interested hunters, outfitters, companies and individuals shall deposit, the call deposit against each trophy mentioned in above table in the name of Chief Conservator Parks & Wildlife Circle Gilgit-Baltistan prior to participation in the auction proceeding.
4. Arrangement of logistics including travel, boarding, lodging, import and export permits, insurance, and visa etc. will be the responsibility of hunters or their facilitators (outfitters or companies).
5. All hunters shall be required to collect their hunting permits by visiting the office of concerned DFO/WLMOs in person. The hunters in collaboration with respective RFOs will be required to present the trophy and the recording of its measurement for physical examination and endorsement by the DFO. However, before submission to the DFO, the trophy size shall be endorsed by the hunter, outfitter and community representative. This will be a pre-requisite for the issuance of NOC for transport of the trophy beyond the jurisdictions of Gilgit-Baltistan.
6. Only the hunters having valid permit will be allowed to hunt. Furthermore, permits issued to GB residents shall not be transferable to non-GB residents on concessional rates.
7. It will be the responsibility of the hunter himself or his facilitator (outfitter or company) to acquire CITES export permit from the National CITES Management Authority, Ministry of Climate Change & Environmental Coordination, Govt. of Pakistan.
8. The respective community organization will be responsible to take the hunter to the hunting site under the supervision of on duty staff of the Department.
9. The Department will not be responsible for any accident, sickness, falling down or death of the hunter or any other person accompanying him.
10. 100% of the hunting permit fees will be retained in case of non-hunt unless for reasons given in clause 19.1 of the GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019.
11. The Department reserves the right to accept or reject any or all the tenders of trophy hunting permits under clause 33(1) of PPRA Rule 2004.
12. The hunting permits shall be Conservancy/CCHA specific and will be non-transferable to any other Conservancy/CCHA unless for reasons mentioned in clause 13.6 of GB Trophy Hunting Guidelines 2019.
13. Successful bidders of trophy hunting permits shall deposit trophy hunting permit fee and other dues within 15 days after the auction date, failing which the earnest money/call deposit will be forfeited and the permit shall be cancelled forthwith.

14. All outfitters/companies shall be required to register with the Department. Registration fee will be 20,000 per outfitter/company and will be valid for a period of 03 years.
15. Any outfitter/company/entity/hunter whose past hunting/outfitting related actions are under scrutiny/investigation shall not be eligible to participate in the bidding.
16. The allocated quota/number can be increased/decreased from given number as per Govt. Policy/Guidelines.

Caution: Hunting of wild ungulates is an extremely challenging sport which requires complete physical fitness and patience. The hunters should be prepared for rugged difficult slopes and extremely cold weather in the mountainous treks.

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
